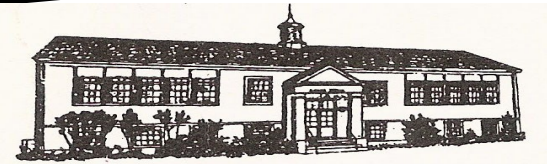

As you all know, we are hosting a Christmas Bazaar on December 11th and 12th. We thought it would be a fun experience for the kids to manufacture their own prod-

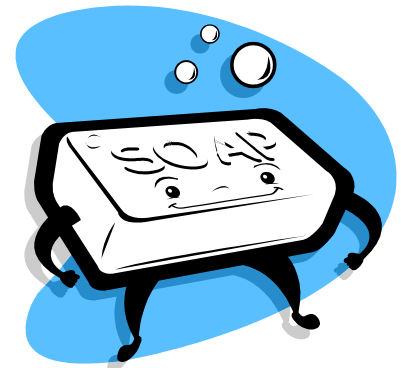
ucts and sell them at the Bazaar.
